



Meaningful Use

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA), includes the Health Information Technology for Economic & Clinical Health Act (HITECH) which provides incentives to physicians who qualify. One of the qualifications is the meaningful use of electronic health records. The proposed criteria for meaningful use were released by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) on December 30, 2009 and are pending final approval. MediSYS EHR is currently certified under CCHIT 08 certification guidelines. Since the standards for meaningful use are based upon CCHIT, we will need to make fewer changes. CCHIT will also be establishing a fast-track option available to CCHIT 08 certified vendors only. We are continuing to work closely with CCHIT and are prepared to meet meaningful use compliance in a timely fashion once the criteria are finalized. These modifications will be provided to MediSYS EHR clients who are under subscription at no additional cost.

Meaningful Use: Guarantee.

We will guarantee that our MediSYS Electronic Healthcare Records software application set forth by CCHIT ARRA Certification Program will meet the meaningful use criteria under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act.

If MediSYS Electronic Health Records application does not meet the Meaningful Use criteria set forth by the CCHIT ARRA Certification Program within 12 months of the official date of the final definition of Meaningful Use, we will credit up to 12 months of the monthly software maintenance fees during the period which the software does not comply with the ARRA criteria.
